

An exclusive glimpse into one of the regions overshadowed by Russia that continue to exist after the fall of the Soviet Union - Pridnestrovie, or Transnistria. The film crew follows two tourist agencies in this media-locked place, telling a humorous yet thought-provoking story about their struggle to turn one of the most overlooked areas in the world into a holiday hotspot. The oldest agency attempts to modernize its business model, while the newest one goes all in, aiming to become a full-fledged tourist franchise. An almost impossible mission, caught between multiple crises and daily life stuck in a time capsule for over 35 years. Nation-building in a nutshell, caught between East and West.

Denis Pavlovic, German-Croatian director and producer from Hamburg. Someone who never takes the easy way and therefore became a documentary film director. Her current projects include the mini-series Pray for Us (Cinelink Drama 2024 - HAVC Award; The Balkan Way - Grand Prix), hybrid feature The 13th Fish, and short Sourdough, supported by the Film Centre of Montenegro. ALL WE HAVE IS US Chile, Germany





All We Have Is Us connects two distant lands wounded by the same threat: Chile's Atacama Desert and Serbia's Jadar Valley, where communities rise against Rio Tinto, the world's second-largest mining company. The film follows Leyla, an Aymara journalist who stopped exploration in her hometown, facing the paradox of a green energy transition that threatens Indigenous culture. In Serbia, Bojana, a young actress, fights to protect her mother's village, weaving local resistance into global networks. She meets Ramón, a defender of Andean wetlands, in an international gathering and together they share strategies, fears, and hopes that collide with geopolitics. Against Rio Tinto's polished promises, the film is an intimate portrait of memory, belonging, and the courage to resist.

ALINE ILIÁREZ Director

Aline Juárez, born in Mexico City and based in Berlin for over a decade, is a filmmaker and cinematographer whose work centers on migrant and diasporic communities, weaving stories across Latin America and Europe. She has directed and collaborated on projects in Germany, Spain, Portugal, Serbia, Brazil, Chile, and Mexico, often exploring socio-environmental struggles through a feminist and decolonial lens. Selected works include Hybrid Zone (Director, 2024, Babelsberg Konrad Wolf), Frutos de Resistencia (Director & Cinematographer, 2023, Interbrigadas e.V.), and Wären Sie mal besser zu Hause geblieben (Director, 2020).

RESISTING RESIDENTS Greece



Between Athens' Supreme Court and Police Headquarters, an unusual community of 500 people from 30 countries lives by the principles of direct democracy. "Prosfygika" is Europe's largest antifa residential squat, facing constant eviction threats amid rising conservatism and repression. Resisting Residents immerses us in their everyday life: collective assemblies, bustling communal kitchens, and relentless struggles against intimidation and violence. Fear turns into courage and solidarity. The film offers a vivid portrait of how resistance, cooperation, and resilience can create an alternative world—one where shared bonds unite rather than



NIKOS PILOS, Director

Nikos Pilos is an Athens-based, award-winning photojournalist and filmmaker celebrated for documenting war, social crises, migration, and human resilience across 60+ countries since 1988. His work appears in The New York Times, TIME, Stern, Der Spiegel, The Financial Times, and other top publications, and has been exhibited widely across Europe and the U.S. He created the cross-media project THE REFUGE, published Kiev Under Siege, and is developing Seven Years of Night, a multilingual online archive on Greece's dictatorship. His films and photo stories, recognized by POY, Px3, MIFA, and World Press Photo, blend cinematic visual power with socially urgent storytelling, capturing the human impact of conflict, displacement, and political upheaval on global communities.

LIFE ON PAUSE Bulgaria



In February 2023, the Bulgarian court rescinds the right of transgender people to change their name and gender marker on their personal documents and delivers a devastating blow to the already embattled community. Gaby destroys her dead-named ID and launches a hunger strike on the steps of Sofia Courthouse captured by international media, but soon she's confronted with losing her job and her parental rights. A court refuses Eda's case despite her impassioned plea, yet she perseveres with her legal battle supported by her chosen family and top human rights lawyers. Caught up in his own legal fight, Valentin strives to protect his Roma family from small-town conservative mores and to marry his fiancée. All three eagerly await a 2026 decision of the European Court that might give new hope.

CONNECTING WITH MIT (W.T.) Greece



Mit is racing against time to shape his legacy through the ARNode: an interdisciplinary hub for artistic research in his seafaring family's ancestral home in Galaxidi, Delphi. One of the world's first media artists, closely connected to the international art-sciencetechnology movement and MIT's Center for Advanced Visual Studies, Mit Mitropoulos has spent six decades experimenting across video, performance, mail art, sculpture, environmental and conceptual art – consistently exploring communication in human settlements, both with and without technology. Capturing Mit's unique, inventive ways of handling everyday life in Galaxidi, Athens and Brussels, and blending rare archival material from the 1960s to the present, this hybrid film unfolds as an intergenerational dialogue between Mit and the filmmaker, his niece. At once humorous, fragile, and urgent, this intimate portrait captures a visionary whose lifelong exploration of networks and communication finds new relevance in the ethical dilemmas of today's digital and AI-driven world.





DIMITRA KOUZI, Director

Dimitra Kouzi is a filmmaker, producer, writer, and audience strategist drawn to cross-cultural stories on identity and belonging. Trained in Media and Communications at LMU Munich, photography, and storytelling, she moves fluidly between image, sound, and text. After more than a decade in journalism (ERT, ZDF, DW, ARTE), in 2015 she founded Kouzi Productions, focusing on creative documentary and cultural projects. Her debut feature PAS-SAGE TO EUROPE won five awards worldwide. A EURODOC alumna, she teaches and consults on impact and audience engagement with partners including Jihlava Emerging Producers, Docu Rough Cut Boutique, LMU, and Benaki Museum. Her work has received support from institutions across Europe, among them the Greek Film Centre, ERT, Goethe Institut, Schwarz Foundation, and Rosa Luxemburg.

BRATSTVO Italy



In Bulgaria there's a spiritual movement deeply rooted in the country, yet still widely unknown. Its disciples follow the word of Master Peter Deunov (1864-1944), aimed at guiding them to enter a new Era of brightness and harmony they believe is close to come. It's the Universal White Brotherhood. An internationally renowned violinist, a former atheist cinema operator, an old eccentric couple, a farmer isolated in the mountains, a young teacher in search of herself – they lead ordinary lives, however all dedicated daily to what they call spiritual work. Every August they ascend the top of the Rila Mountains, at an altitude of 2300 meters, to gather and pray. It is said that access to the new Era requires mankind to rise spiritually, and this is the path these people are looking to follow.





MARCO SCHIAVON, Director

Marco Schiavon was born in Treviso, Italy, in 1993. In 2016 moved to Portugal where he studied Documentary Cinema. His first short documentary, Água nas guelras, shot in the Azores Islands, was selected and participated in IDFA Docs for Sale and Torino Short Film Market. It premiered in 2022 at the FICG — Guadalajara International Film Festival, Mexico, and was then selected in more than 20 international festivals. Marco is now working on his first feature-length documentary, Bratstvo - The Brotherhood, now in development. The project won the Development Regional Fund in Italy and has been selected for the MakeCoProDox Forum. From 2020 to 2022 Marco worked on the Portuguese documentary series Atrás dos Tempos. His new short doc Exploração is in post-production, to be released in 2026.
